

AppleScript

What is AppleScript?

- Built into Mac OS X
- Used to control existing applications
- Automates time consuming and repetitive tasks



Benefits of AppleScript

- Faster
- Fewer mistakes
- Accurate
- Consistent
- Higher quality results



Benefits of AppleScript

- Unattended operation
- Server-based automation
- Integrate multi-platforms
- Expand application features
- Build interfaces



What AppleScript Can Do


- Batch processing
- Database publishing
- Image manipulation and conversion
- File/folder maintenance
- Much more!



Scriptable Applications

- Applications must support AppleScript
- Level of AppleScript support may vary from application to application
- Terminology may change between versions
- Scriptable applications include an AppleScript dictionary

Automator

What is Automator?

- Released with Mac OS X 10.4 Tiger
- Received major overhaul with Mac OS X 10.5 Leopard
- Automates time consuming and repetitive tasks on your Mac
- No scripting or programming necessary



The Benefits of Automator

- Brings the power of multi-application automation to the user level!
- Reduces user errors
- Reduces time consuming and repetitive tasks
- Allows for unattended automation
- Leaves more time to enjoy life :-)



What Automator's Good For?

- Automating simple tasks in one or multiple applications
- Batch manipulating files, music, photos, and more
- Adding custom functions to applications



What Automator's Not Good For?

- Automating super-complex tasks
- Analyzing situations and taking different courses of action

- No scripting or coding required




