Ripping and converting CDs

You know the drill:

- Jam a CD into your Mac's media drive
- iTunes will launch (by default) and you'll be asked if you want to rip it.
- You can choose to do it later. Then select CD and click Rip CD button.
- Consider Advanced -> Join Tracks (for audiobook CDs in particular).

Ripping and converting DVDs

Two-stage process

- Remove copy-protection
 - Leaves you with unprotected Video_TS folder
- Convert to playable format
- Recommendations:
 - Handbrake, Riplt, MacTheRipper

Ripping and converting DVDs

- What is your final goal?
 - Create a file that can be played on your Mac, phone, media server
 - Create a DVD

Ripping and converting DVDs HandBrake (free, http://handbrake.fr)

Rips and converts

- Removing copy-protection requires VLC (www.videolan.org/vlc)
- Can convert to a variety of formats, including all iOS devices, iPods, and Apple TVs
- Can convert from Video_TS folder
- Vastly configurable
- Demo

Ripping and converting DVDs Riplt (\$19, http://ripitapp.com)

Rips and (now) converts

- Natively removes copy-protection
- Can rip entire disc as DVD Player document
- Can also now convert to a variety of formats
- Updated frequently to address new DRM schemes
- Demo

Ripping and converting DVDs MacTheRipper ("donation," www.ripdifferent.com/forum)

- Rips to unprotected Video_TS folder but doesn't convert
- Natively removes copy-protection
- Can rip entire disc or just selected features

Ripping and converting DVDs MacTheRipper ("donation," www.ripdifferent.com/forum)

- When you have an unprotected Video_TS folder, drop it into Toast
- Select the content from the disk that you want to burn to a DVD video or
- Re-compress the entire original disk to fit onto a single DVD

Ripping and converting DVDs The 99 Chapter Trick

- Some DVDs are difficult to rip because they have dozens of "fake" main features. Rip the wrong one and your movie is no good. To spot the real main feature:
 - Play main feature of DVD in DVD Player
 - Choose Go -> Title and look at the checked number
 - This tells you which is the main feature title

- Adding a BluRay drive
 - External drive usually USB-2 or e-SATA
 - Buy an internal BluRay drive and put it in an external enclosure
 - Build a Hackintosh and put in an internal drive
 - No DVD playback on the Mac

MakeMKV

- Strips protection from the disk and writes out a single MKV file
- As with DVDs, you have the option to pick which tracks you want from the DVD
- You can also select audio tracks, which allows you to ignore tracks that you aren't set up to play back, anyway

- Pass resulting MKV to Handbrake
 - Configure settings
 - Demo

- Handling broken audio
 - TSMuxer for Windows

Capturing streaming content

- We're talking about two sources:
 - External (video and audio in)
 - Internet

Capturing streaming content External sources

- Video: Old VCR tapes that you'd like to digitize, camcorder media
- Audio: Records and tapes

Capturing streaming content External video

- If your camcorder supports video pass-thru, use it.
 Connect VCR to camera and camera to Mac via USB or FireWire. Capture with iMovie.
- Roxio Easy VHS to DVD (\$80, www.roxio.com)
- Elgato Video Capture (\$100, www.elgato.com)

Capturing streaming content External audio

- There are loads of applications that will capture audio coming in via the Mac's sound input port.
- Need a pre-amp or receiver for non-USB turntables
 - Cheap: Audacity (free, audacity.sourceforge.net)
 - BIAS Inc's SoundSaver (\$50, www.bias-inc.com)


- Firefox add-ons by the score
- Videobox (\$15, www.tastyapps.com)
 - iShowU HD (\$30, www.shinywhitebox.com)

Converting audiobooks

- Audiobook Builder (\$10, www.splasm.com)
 - Will combine multiple short tracks (from audiobook CDs) into longer tracks. You determine the length of sections by choosing what to join.
 - Creates iOS-compatible files and adds to iTunes
