Combines features of:

- Local home directory
- Network home directory

Local home directory

- User data on the local hard drive
- Works on or off the network
- Not easily accessible from other
 - computers
- Hard to backup and protect

Network home directory

- User data on a network share
- If the machine goes off the network, the home is not accessible
- Accessible from other computers
- Easily backed up and protected



Portable home directory

- User data on local drive
- Synchronized with a network share
- Accessible from other computers
- Easily backed up and protected



Mobile accounts with Portable Home Directories:

- Locally cache temporary files
- Can create less network traffic than network accounts
- Can be managed like network accounts

Mobile accounts with Portable Home Directories:

- Allow users to access their accounts and files when disconnected from the network
- Allow users to recover their data if their computers are lost or damaged

Mobile accounts with Portable Home Directories:

- Can negatively impact server performance
- Can confuse users due to incomplete synchronization
- Can cause login and logout delays
- Do not eliminate the need for backups!



What are PHDs good for?



Laptop users

- They're not always on the network, so network homes are no good
- Purely local homes are hard to back up
- PHDs can be a best-of-both-worlds



What are PHDs good for?



Desktop users

- On a slow WAN link network homes too slow
- heavy users of certain apps that have undesirable behaviors on network homes (one rhymes with Padobe Rotoshop)

Creating a mobile account/portable home directory




- Accounts pane of System Preferences
- Workgroup Manager/MCX
- via a script




Accountspane ofSystemPreferences

user is prompted at next login





- Workgroup Manager / MCX
- Preferences:Mobility
- Manage by user, group, or computer list





- via a script:
 sudo defaults write /Library/Preferences/
 com.apple.loginwindow mobileAccountActions
 '{ usershortname = { archiveDeletedHome = 0;
 createAtLogin = 1; deleteAtLogout = 0;
 deleteHomeWithAccount = 0; }; }'
- Does the same thing as checking "Create mobile account" in Accounts pane
- also...
 sudo /System/Library/CoreServices/mcxd.app/
 Contents/Resources/MCXCacher -U usershortname





- Synchronization types
 - Login/Logout sync
 - Background sync
 - Manual sync



- Login/Logout sync
 - by default, certain parts of ~/Library
 - controlled by defaults keys:
 - syncedPrefFolders
 - excludedPrefItems
 - No user interface to customize



- Background sync
 - by default, most of the home folder, except ~/Library
 - controlled by defaults keys:
 - syncedFolders
 - excludedItems
 - syncPeriodSeconds
 - default is 1200 seconds (20 minutes)
 - min is 5 mins, max is 60 mins



- Manual sync
 - same items as Background sync
 - initiate from HomeSync menu
 - Background and manual sync may be customized by user via Home Sync Preferences.... 🤶 🖅 ♠)) Mon 9:22 AM

- /System/Library/CoreServices/ mcxd.app/Contents/Resources/ CinchDefaults.plist
- ~/Library/Preferences/ com.apple.homeSync.plist
- MCX (Workgroup Manager)



CinchDefaults.plist keys

- excludedAlways can't be overridden
- excludedItems
- excludedPrefltems
- syncedFolders
- syncedPrefFolders

these defaults can be overridden by MCX or user's com.apple.homeSync.plist

- excludedItems
- excludedPrefltems
- syncedFolders
- syncedPrefFolders
- syncPeriodSeconds

can be overidden by or merged with MCX






Users can elect to sync "everything" in their home, or just certain toplevel folders


Workgroup Manager (MCX)

Login & Logout Sync

corresponds to syncedPrefsFolders defaults key

corresponds to excludedPrefsItems defaults key

Match type caveats






Workgroup Manager (MCX)

Background & Manual Sync

corresponds to syncedFolders defaults key corresponds to excludedItems defaults key

turn this off to prevent user customization with the Accounts pane






Workgroup Manager (MCX)

Options

corresponds to periodicSyncOn defaults key

corresponds to syncPeriodSeconds defaults key






Changes to consider



Top-level folders:



excludedItems

```
{comparison = fullPath; value = "~/Movies"; },
{comparison = fullPath; value = "~/Music"; },
{comparison = fullPath; value = "~/Pictures"; },
```

(user education is *critical* here - if you exclude these, users must realize the implications)



Mail.app:

```
excludedPrefltems
```

```
{comparison = startsWith; value = "Exchange-"; }
```

- Excludes local copies of Exchange messages in Mail.app's cache
- compare the default exclusions for IMAP and mac.com:



Microsoft Entourage

- Stores everything in one big file in
 ~/Documents/Microsoft User Data/
- •The Entourage DB shouldn't be synced while it's open





Microsoft Entourage

- Add {comparison = fullPath;
 value = "~/Documents/Microsoft User Data"; }
 to excludedItems
- Add {path = "~/Documents/Microsoft User Data"; } to syncedPrefFolders
- Add {comparison = fullPath; value = "~/Documents/Microsoft User Data/ Entourage Temp"; } to excludedPrefItems





Microsoft Entourage

Syncing the Entourage DB only at login/logout prevents file corruption issues, but makes logins and logouts take longer





Norton Anti-Virus

excludedItems

```
{comparison = fullPath; value = "~/NAVMac800QSFile"; }, {comparison = fullPath; value = "~/.SymAVQSFile"; }
```

(Excludes files generated by Norton Anti-Virus scanning)





Managing PHDs

Without MCX

directly manage each user's ~/Library/Preferences/com/apple.homeSync.plist

a good job for a login item






- Space mismatch!
 - Available space for local home > available space for network home



- Space mismatch strategies
 - Exclude "big" folders:





- Space mismatch strategies
 - Communicate network home quotas



 Network filesystem has different features

NFS homes allow two files with differing case:

~/apple.jpg

~/APPLE.jpg



 Items in home not readable by home's owner



Background sync delay

with multiple machines

Workaround: do a manual sync





Files accessed on multiple computers

Users can easily stomp on their own files



• Synchronization: Local or Network?

Need to teach users the difference, and encourage single log on whenever possible.





Synchronization conflict alerts

Users can be confused





Synchronization conflict alerts

com.apple.homeSync keys to suppress these:

loginConflictResolution

who wins login/logout conflicts values (integer):

0 = show conflict dialog

I = local home wins

2 = network home wins

DANGER: this may also affect the first time sync



Synchronization conflict alerts

com.apple.homeSync keys to suppress these:

periodicConflictResolution

who wins background/Sync Now conflicts values (integer):

0 = show conflict dialog

I = local home wins

2 = network home wins

DANGER: this may also affect the first time sync



Synchronization error alerts

com.apple.homeSync keys to suppress these:

loginSuppressErrors

suppress login/logout sync error messages

values (boolean):

true = suppress error dialogs

false = show error dialogs





Synchronization error alerts

com.apple.homeSync keys to suppress these:

periodicSuppressErrors

suppress background sync/Sync Now error

messages

values (boolean):

true = suppress error dialogs

false = show error dialogs





Disabling Synchronization Alerts:

Beware





- ~/Library/Logs/MirrorAgent.log
 - Increase level of detail with defaults write com.apple.MirrorAgent debugOutput x (where x is I-4)
 - Sync decision trees:
 defaults write com.apple.MirrorAgent printTrees I
 This generates a lot of data, but can be very
 instructive




Some common errors

MHD DSKFULERR

almost human-readable!

Mobile Home
Directory
Disk Full Error your network home
is full!





Some common errors

MHD DSKFULERR - it looks even worse in the log:

Wed Mar 22 11:38:29.636 2006 *** Syncing "HomeSync Mirror"

Wed Mar 22 II:38:37 2006: /SourceCache/MirrorAgent-99.8. I/FileSync-99.8. I/Agent/

Engine/whatis.m,261 err -5000 (iterateref)

copyCallback: got error -1425 at stage 3.

Wed Mar 22 11:39:50 2006: /SourceCache/MirrorAgent-99.8.1/FileSync-99.8.1/Agent/

Engine/syncio.m,759 err - 1425 (cpfile)

Wed Mar 22 II:39:50 2006: /SourceCache/MirrorAgent-99.8. I/FileSync-99.8. I/Agent/

Engine/syncio.m,68 err -1425 (syncjobaddobj)

Some common errors

```

Network home contains both

- .Alias
- .alias
- local HFS+ disk can't have both items in the same folder.



Some common errors

Mon Sep 25 11:12:12 2006: /SourceCache/MirrorAgent-99.9.3/ FileSync-99.9.3/Agent/Engine/mirrordb.m,193 err -39 (getmirrordb)

Error -39 is unexpected end-of-file on the mirrordb, so it looks like the Mirror database is damaged. You'll need to delete the Mirror database and start fresh.



Deleting the Mirror database

Brute force method:

- Make sure the PHD user is logged out
- sudo rm -rf /Users/shortusername/Library/Mirrors

This will also delete any .Mac sync mirrors.


A more careful method would edit the contents of /Users/shortusername/Library/Mirrors/mirrors.plist, removing the dict with name "HomeSync_Mirror" and the "here" and "there" djmirror.db files...

This is an exercise left for the reader.



Deleting the Mirror database

Once the HomeSync mirror database is removed, when the user logs in again, they'll see a dialog:



Choose carefully!



Worst case scenario:

Syncing won't, and you have no time.

- Make sure the user has anything saved out of their account they need.
- 2. Copy off any prefs (Mail) from Library.
- Log in as local admin, go into the Accounts prefs pane, and delete the account.

The account will recreate on next log in with version from Network.



Disney Animation Studios

- Directory Service
 - OpenLDAP / RHDS
 - No OpenDirectory or MCX
- Network Homes
 - NFS on NetApp filers
- Special tools
 - makeMobileUser script
 - homeSyncCompositor script
 - HomeSync Preferences.app






Disney Animation Studios

HomeSync Preferences.app

Used in our environment; gives users some additional feedback so they don't exceed network quota

Allows users to exclude only top-level folders in their home





Ventura County Star


- Directory Service
 - AD-OD Integration (Golden Triangle)
- Portable Home Directories
 - AFP homes on XServe G5
- Special tools
 - Workgroup Manager (not very special)





Ventura County Star

- Workgroup Manager
 - Preferences are set via User Groups.
 - AD Groups nested within OD Groups (plus user accounts).
 - Client computers are static, built from image.
 - To do: Customize network view via computer groups.
